

A study from the Archives of Sexual Behavior examined 52,000 adults and the results came in: heterosexual women only orgasmed 60% of the time compared to



THE HISTORY OF VIRGINITY

Throughout history, women have been handed down from fathers to husbands as property through marriage. Sexual purity was highly desired by society's men to act as a paternity test. In other words, virgins were desired because it ensured the purity of a bloodline and that all of the wives' children belonged to the husband. This was all so that men in leadership roles could build labor forces consisting of their children. Thus, virginity was created to control women. MISINFORMATION ABOUT VIRGINITY

In order to keep this system of oppression in place, society has relied on disseminating an oversaturated amount of misinformation about virginity. Society has suggested that virginity determines purity and that a woman's value is negatively linked to her sexuality. It suggests that men should be rewarded for losing their virginity while women should be shamed for losing their virginity. the myth of virginity is responsible for promoting the misinformation that the hymen will be broken, torm, or bled during first-time intercourse. The concept of virginity also ignores non-heteronormative by dictating that sex only constitutes penetration sex centering around the penis and vagina.



VIRGINITY IN ART & FILM

In Ancient Greece, virginal goddesses were worshipped at an extreme rate relative to the other non-virginal goddesses. This is because virginity was considered the highest virtue. For example, even Athena-the patron wisdom goddess of Athens-prized virginity. She saw intellectual stimulation as a purer form of love than any physical enactment of it. Similarly, in Christianity, virginity is also fetishized and made holy. The most prolific example of this is the Virgin Mary. she was the single most recently depicted female figure in art of the 18th centurythe new show Jane the Virgin uses a comedic approach to discuss virginity, it signals a shift in how "chastity is artistically presented in contemporary culture." In other words, the show foregrounds her [the eponymous Jane] virginity—it's in the title, after all—but it doesn't portray it as either a burden or a crusade."



VIRGINITY IN MODERN TIMES

If the negative consequences of the virginity myth seem archaic and outdated, you'd be surprised about how little we've progressed. For example, in just 2005, an Alabama woman claimed to kill her 12-year-old daughter because her daughter revealed she had "lost" her virginity. Hymenoplasties have also become a growing trend as more and more women get plastic surgery to "restore" and "fix" their hymens in order to somehow mimic virginity. Purity balls are a formal dance that promotes abstinence until marriage and is attended by father and daughter duos.
